- record their skills, qualifications and experience in one secure, online location
- record all their work, education and training experiences, language skills, digital skills, volunteering experiences and achievements.
- store diplomas, reference letters, certificates and other important documents

Create Your Europass CV

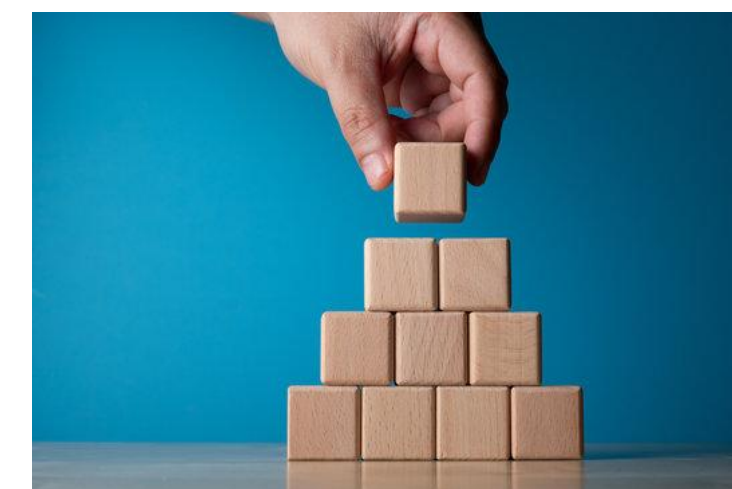
The best known CV format in Europe

Once you have your Europass profile fully set up, you can create your CV by selecting the items you want to include and within a few clicks of a button, you will have your completed CV.

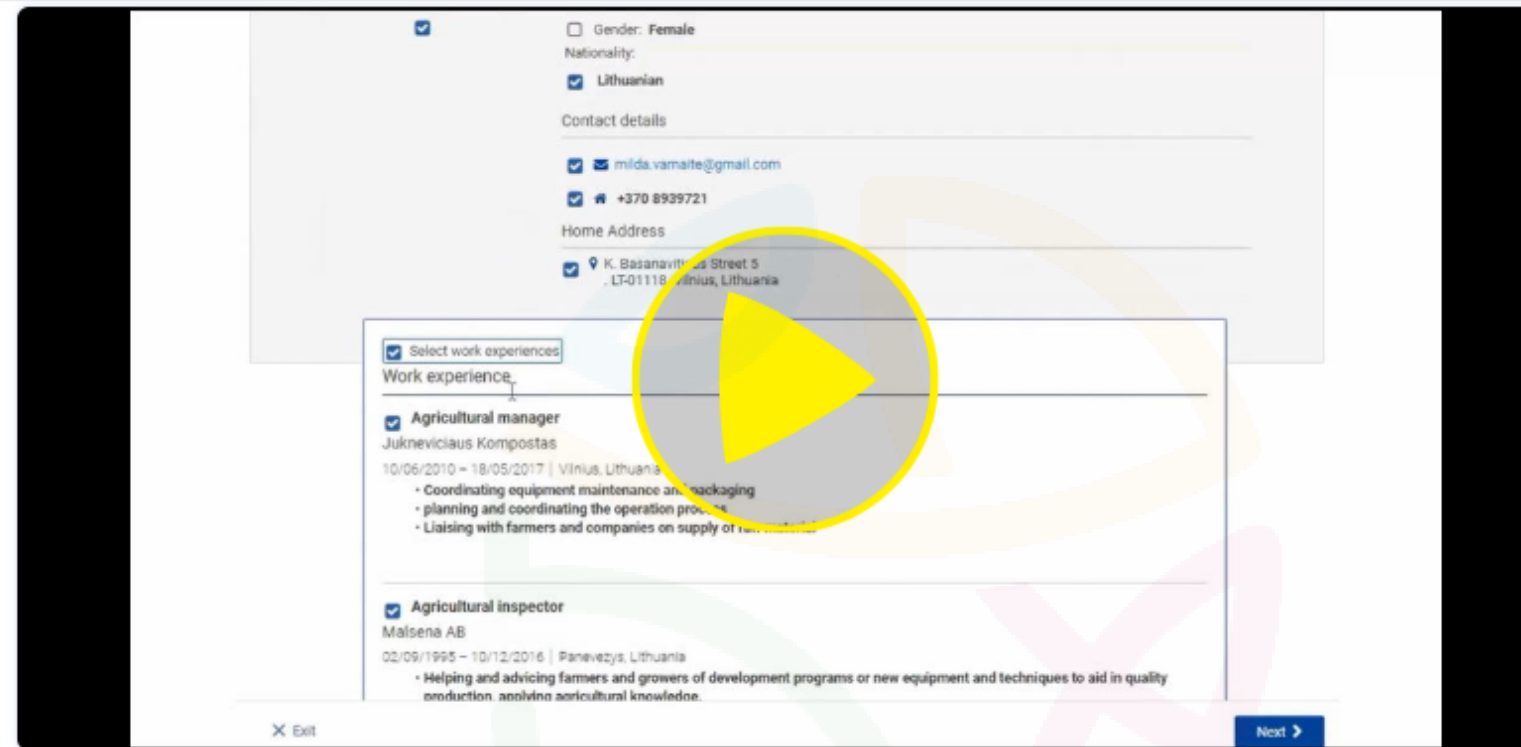
Just select the information which you want to include, pick your preferred style / design from the options given and let Europass do the rest

Remember that your CV is your first opportunity to communicate your skills and experiences to a future employer. It is a snapshot of who you are, your skills, your educational background, work experiences and other achievements.

Create Cover Letter

Europass enables you to make the right first impression through a structured, consistent and professional cover letter / motivation letter

- Europass guides you step by step along your cover letter
- You can create new cover letters OR
- Edit existing ones to suit the job you are applying for
- Europass cover letter is also available in 31 languages
- You can choose from different designs to customise your cover letter according to your preferences
- Users can save them in the Europass library or download them



How to Write a Good Cover Letter

- A cover letter should serve to highlight your motivation to apply for that specific job
- It should show clearly why you consider yourself as the best candidate for the job you are applying for
- Your cover letter should make an impact on the employer and convince him/her to look at your CV
- Europass provides you with a few tips on how to write an effective cover letter – Read carefully, be brief, use keywords...

Test Your Digital Skills

In today's labour market, digital skills are key. Most jobs require some level of digital proficiency – send an email, book a resource, uploading of documents in online repositories...

By taking the digital skills test, you will go through a set of easy questions based on the Digital Competence framework that is aimed and structured to understand your skills level in a clear manner.

Upon completing the test, you will get a detailed report with a description of your average level.

Through this test, you can easily identify your strong and weak points, thus being in a position to improve your digital skills.





The European Qualifications Framework

The EU developed the European Qualifications Framework (EQF) to make national qualifications easier to understand and more comparable. The EQF seeks to support cross-border mobility of learners and workers, promote lifelong learning and professional development across Europe.

The EQF has 8 levels, covers all types of qualifications and serves as a translation tool between different national qualifications frameworks, hence improving transparency, comparability and portability of people's qualifications and makes it possible to compare qualifications from different countries and institutions.

The EQF is closely linked to national qualifications frameworks

To apply, you must:

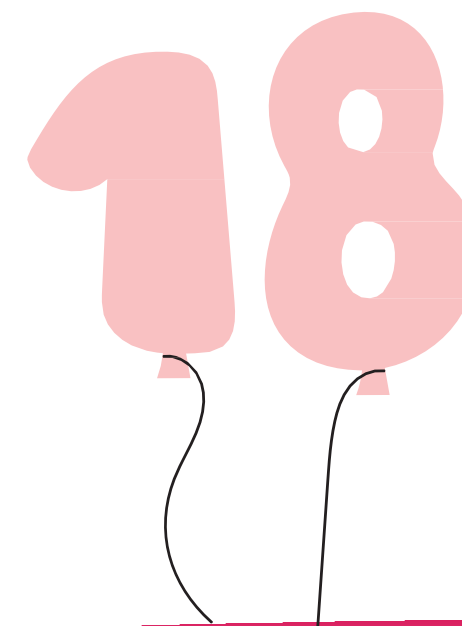
Be 18 years old on the first day of the travel period.

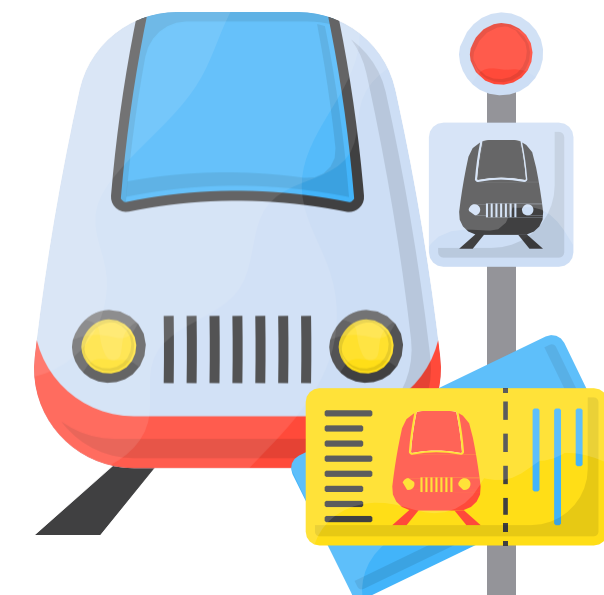

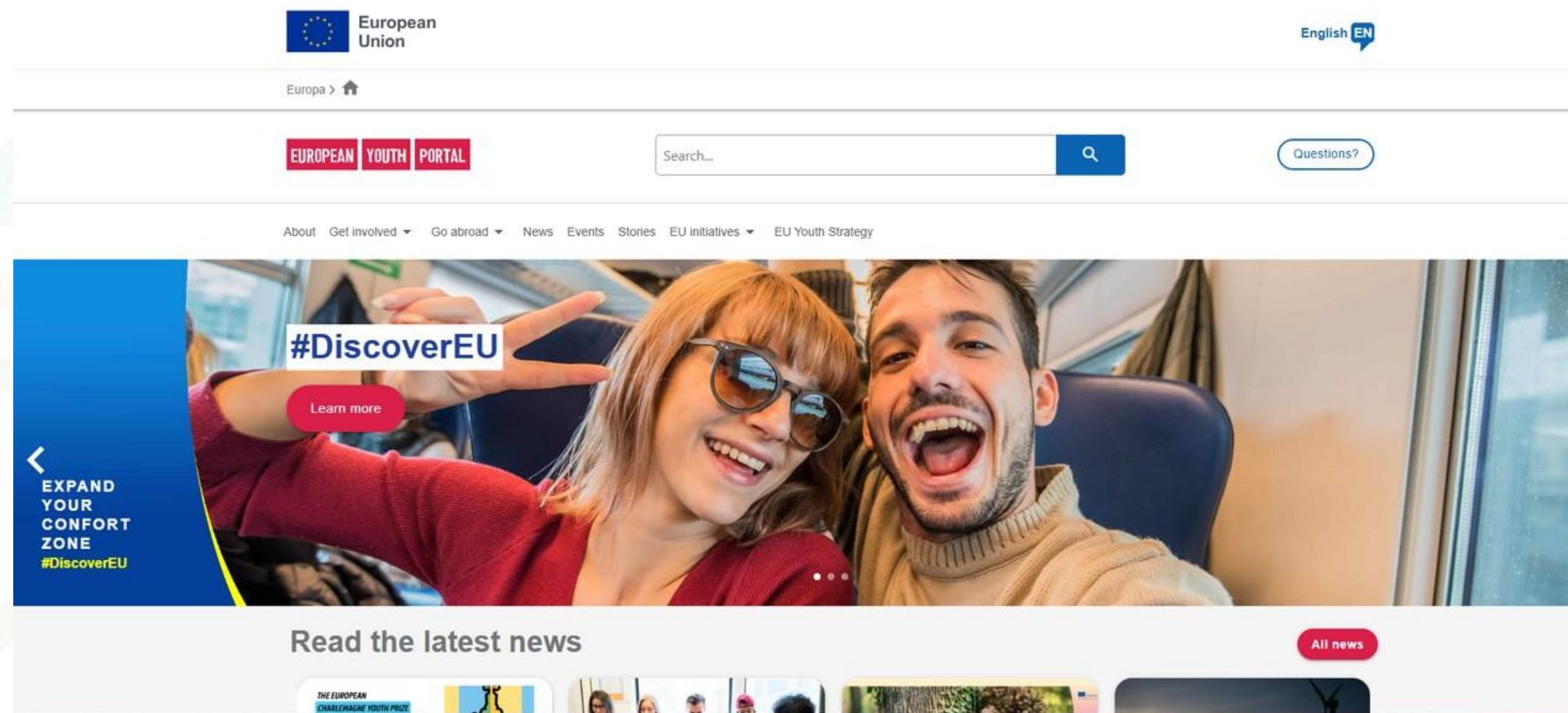

Mobility of Young People (KA152)

Youth Exchanges:

Organisations or informal groups of young people from at least two different countries. The goal is to unite young people from diverse backgrounds, allowing them to exchange ideas and learn in a non-formal educational setting.

- Workshops
- Exercises
- Debates
- Role-plays
- Simulations
- Outdoor activities



Youth Participation Activities (KA154)

A key action that, fosters and facilitates young people's participation in Europe's democratic life. For example: Youth activism, civic action.

Youth participation activities can be either transnational or national implemented at local level and involving informal group(s) of young people or organisations.

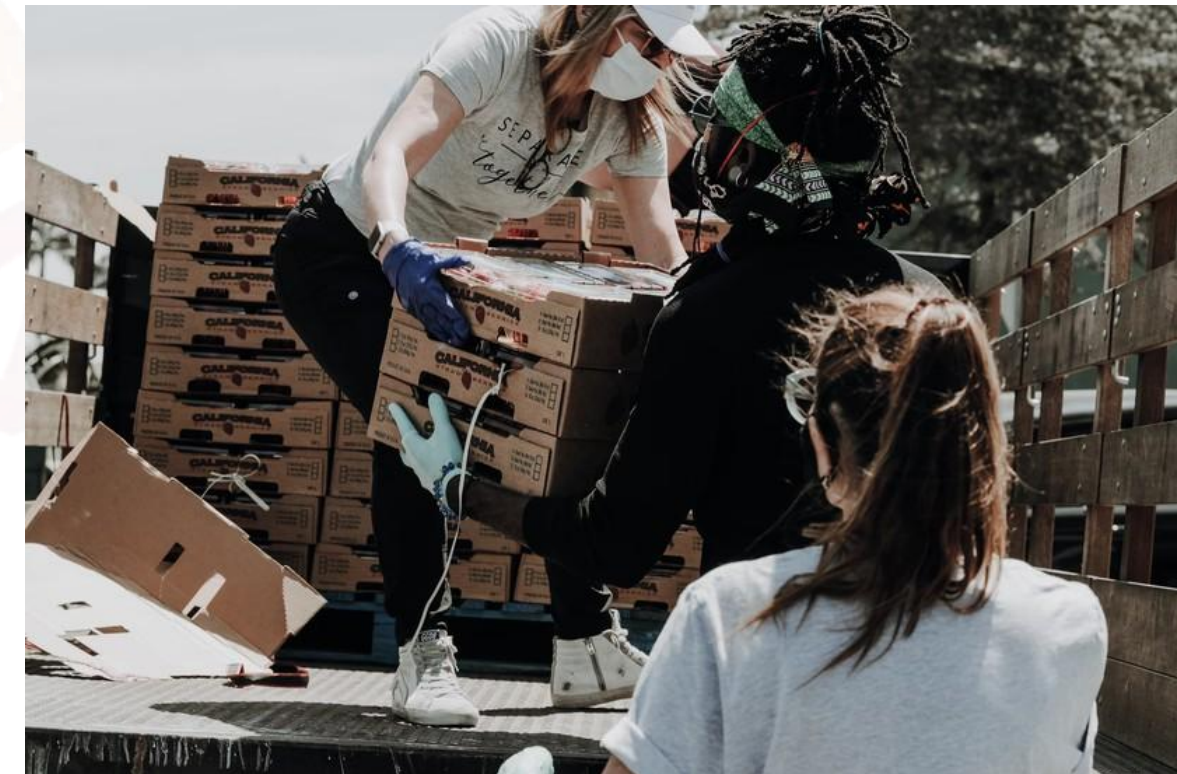

Solidarity Projects - ESC30

Participation in a solidarity project is an important non formal learning experience through which young people can boost their personal, educational, social and civic development.

It's a project that directly addresses key challenges within the communities.





Volunteering Projects - ESC51

Individual volunteering is a way for young people aged between 18-30 to support the daily operation of organisations engaged in solidarity efforts, ultimately benefiting the communities where these activities take place across the European Union.

The volunteering period can last between 2 weeks and 12 months.

One gets a set amount of money for support, depending on which country they volunteer at.





Young people wishing to engage in such activities need to register on the **European Solidarity Corps portal**.
